

CAP's annual open day

THE Community Arts Project opens its doors to the public on Saturday for a day of art, dance, drama and music.

CAP holds its annual open day for the public to view and buy the year's work by full-time and part-time students.

Artworks including paintings, pottery, ceramic sculpture, photographs and wood-cut prints will be on exhibition throughout the day.

During the morning artwork, magazines, books, printed clothing, jewellery and food will be on sale at stalls held by other community, arts and educational organisations.

Throughout the afternoon will be performances by CAP's dance, drama, music and creative writing students.

The dance group will perform *Fly Eagle, Fly* based on a locally written and illustrated children's book.

Flute, guitar and saxophone students will jam and Pedro Espi-Sanchos and his group will perform music based on traditional African rhythms.

The Open Day is at CAP's premises at 106 Chapel Street.

CAP was established in 1977 to encourage development of the arts and provides classes and workshops in various facets of the arts for children and adults.
