## Dual aim for CAP festival

THE Community Arts Project (CAP) will mark the end of this decade with a festival providing a forum for the work of CAP students and a chance for the exchange of skills and ideas with other community cultural organisations.

Titled **Building a National Culture**, the festival will run from December 1-10; although most of the activities will take place at the Project's Woodstock headquarters (106 Chapel street), a number of events will also be performed at selected township venues.

Featuring seminars, theatre, music concerts and children's entertainment, the festival includes participants from a number of organisations and commun-

ity groups (COSAW, MAPP, Molo Songolo, Jazzart and the New Africa Theatre Project, to name a few) as well as input from CAP student/staff.

Highlights include:

- An ongoing seminar programme every night from December 4-8, focusing on various aspects of culture (theatre, art, music). Each session will start at 5pm, and run for 2½ hours.

- A children's festival, to be held on December 9 at St Gabriels in Guguletu.

- CAP Theatre every night at 8.
